## Cadiz Taps Two Builders for \$403M Southern California Water Pipeline

A major water infrastructure project is moving into the construction phase in San Bernardino County, where Cadiz Inc. has awarded contracts to two established heavy-civil firms to build out its Northern Pipeline. The roughly \$403 million effort will convert a 220-mile natural gas pipeline into a water conveyance system designed to deliver supplies to communities across Southern California. The work marks one of the more unusual large-scale water projects to reach the construction stage in the region, repurposing existing linear infrastructure rather than trenching an entirely new corridor.

W.M. Lyles Co. and Mike Bubalo Construction Co. have been selected as the builders on the project. Both bring deep experience in California water and underground work, and their selection signals that the pipeline conversion is transitioning from planning into active field execution. For contractors and suppliers watching Southern California's water sector, the award is a clear indicator that meaningful subcontracting and material-supply opportunities are now in play along a very long project alignment.

The driving force behind the project is the persistent search for new and reliable water supplies in the Southern California interior. San Bernardino County and surrounding communities face the same pressures confronting much of the state: constrained imported supplies, aging distribution systems, and growing demand. Converting a former natural gas line into a water conveyance route allows Cadiz to establish a long-haul delivery backbone while leveraging an existing 220-mile corridor, an approach that can reduce some of the permitting and right-of-way hurdles that typically slow greenfield pipeline construction.

In concrete construction terms, the scope centers on transforming a pipeline originally engineered to move natural gas

into one capable of safely and reliably carrying potable or raw water. That conversion is not a simple swap. It involves inspecting and rehabilitating the existing steel pipe, addressing internal linings and coatings suited to water rather than gas, and reworking or replacing valves, fittings, and appurtenances throughout the alignment. Pump stations, metering facilities, and control structures will typically be required to move water across such a long distance and to interconnect with receiving systems.

Because the pipeline stretches 220 miles, the work will almost certainly be executed in phases and across multiple geographic segments. Long linear projects of this type lend themselves to sequenced construction, with crews mobilizing along defined reaches to perform excavation at access points, tie-ins, and structure locations. Earthwork will be needed wherever the existing line must be exposed, repaired, or reconnected, and wherever new above-ground facilities such as pump stations and storage or metering sites are built. Site grading, foundations, and containment structures at those facilities represent discrete packages of work.

The conversion also carries a heavy mechanical and electrical component. Pumping water across a corridor of this length requires substantial horsepower, meaning pump and motor installation, piping manifolds, and associated electrical service and controls. SCADA and instrumentation systems to monitor flow, pressure, and water quality along the route are standard on modern conveyance projects. That combination of civil, mechanical, and electrical scope means the project will draw on a broad spectrum of trades rather than a single discipline.

For contractors, the range of work suggests opportunities well beyond the two prime builders. Pipeline rehabilitation and coating specialists, welders and pipe fitters, electrical and instrumentation contractors, pump and mechanical installers, and earthwork and grading crews all have a potential role. Concrete subcontractors will be needed for structure foundations and facility slabs, while suppliers of pipe fittings, valves, pumps, and control equipment stand to benefit from procurement on a project of this magnitude. Firms with experience in remote, long-corridor work in the California desert environment will be particularly well positioned.

The scale of the contracts, totaling approximately \$403 million, underscores the volume of labor and material the project will consume. Work spread over hundreds of miles and multiple facility sites typically translates into extended schedules and sustained crew demand, which can be attractive for subcontractors looking for backlog stability. It also means logistics, staging, and access planning will be significant considerations, given the length of the alignment and the likelihood that portions run through sparsely developed terrain.

With the prime contracts now awarded, the immediate opportunity for other firms lies in the subcontractor and supplier tiers. Contractors interested in participating should be reaching out to W.M. Lyles and Mike Bubalo Construction to

understand how the work will be packaged, which segments will be prioritized, and what specialty scopes the primes intend to subcontract. Establishing relationships early, before segment-by-segment buyout accelerates, is often the difference between winning packages and missing them on projects of this length.

Firms positioning for a role should prepare to demonstrate relevant experience in water conveyance, pipeline rehabilitation, and desert or remote-corridor construction. Documenting qualifications for pump station and electrical work, coating and lining scopes, and long-haul pipe handling will help subcontractors stand out. Given the water-utility nature of the end use, contractors should also anticipate the quality, testing, and disinfection requirements that accompany potable water systems, and be ready to staff accordingly.

More broadly, the Cadiz Northern Pipeline reflects a continuing appetite in California for creative water-supply solutions and the construction dollars that follow. As the state wrestles with drought cycles and supply reliability, projects that add new conveyance and delivery capacity are likely to keep generating work for heavy-civil, mechanical, and electrical contractors. The repurposing model at the heart of this project may also draw attention from other agencies weighing whether existing linear infrastructure can be adapted for water use.

For Southern California builders, the message is straightforward: a large, multi-phase water project with hundreds of millions of dollars in construction value is now under way in San Bernardino County. Contractors and suppliers with the right qualifications should be tracking the project's phasing and buyout closely, engaging the two prime builders, and lining up the crews, equipment, and material commitments needed to compete for the packages that will roll out along the 220-mile route.

## Cross-Border Sewage Crisis Signals Work at Imperial Beach

A persistent sewage pollution problem in Imperial Beach is disrupting local recreation, forcing a surf camp to bus children to cleaner beaches and prompting junior lifeguard programs to relocate up the coast, according to CalMatters.

The contamination stems from cross-border flows that have long fouled the waters near the San Diego County commu-

nity, an issue that has drawn attention to the aging and overwhelmed wastewater infrastructure serving the region.

For contractors, the ongoing crisis underscores the scale of treatment and conveyance improvements needed along the southern coastline. Federal and state efforts to address

transboundary sewage have historically involved upgrades to treatment plants and collection systems near the border.

Firms working in water and wastewater construction should watch for public funding tied to remediation of the Tijuana River watershed and related facilities, which could translate into future public-works opportunities in San Diego County.

## **Court Upholds SoCal Gas Appliance Limits Affecting Four Counties**

A federal appeals court has cleared the way for Southern California air regulators to enforce new restrictions on the sale of certain gas-powered appliances, including commercial and industrial water heaters. The 9th Circuit Court of Appeals issued a 2-1 ruling last week upholding the limits.

The rules apply across four Los Angeles-area counties and had drawn opposition from businesses and developers who challenged the restrictions in court. With the ruling standing, the limits on gas commercial and industrial appliances can now move forward.

For contractors, the decision signals a continued push toward electrification in the region's commercial and industrial building sector. Mechanical and plumbing firms bidding new construction and retrofit work in the affected counties should anticipate specifications shifting away from gas appliances toward electric alternatives.

Developers and general contractors planning projects in the Los Angeles area may need to adjust equipment selections and coordinate with subcontractors on compliant systems, potentially affecting cost estimates and scheduling on upcoming work.

## **Skanska-Stacy Witbeck Team Wins \$1.9B LA Light Rail Segment**

A joint venture between Skanska and Stacy Witbeck has secured a \$1.9 billion contract to build a new light rail segment for the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority.

The team will construct a 6.7-mile at-grade line in Van Nuys, adding to Metro's expanding transit network in the San Fernando Valley.

The large-scale award signals continued heavy investment in Southern California transit infrastructure, opening opportunities for subcontractors and suppliers tied to rail, grading, and civil work along the corridor.

Contractors pursuing public transit work in Los Angeles County should watch for subcontracting and procurement packages as the project moves into construction.

## **Skanska's LAX Outreach Signals Openings for Small, Local Contractors**

Contractors chasing public work in Southern California have a fresh data point on how large program managers are filling out their subcontractor rosters. On a major project at Los Angeles International Airport, general contractor Skanska met its small business hiring targets, and the firm's disadvantaged business enterprise compliance officer, Teresa Maxwell, has laid out the playbook the company uses to connect with contractors located near its job sites.

The takeaway for firms working California public works is straightforward: the demand for qualified small, local, and disadvantaged business enterprises on big airport and infrastructure programs is real, and the primes running those programs are actively looking for firms to fill those roles. For subcontractors that have historically struggled to break into large, complex projects, the outreach effort at LAX represents a concrete example of how those opportunities are being distributed.

Large public projects like the ongoing modernization work at LAX typically carry participation goals for disadvantaged business enterprises. Those goals, tied to the flow of federal and local funding that supports airport and transportation improvements, obligate the prime contractor to make good-faith efforts to award a defined share of the work to certified small and disadvantaged firms. Meeting or exceeding those goals, as Skanska reported doing, requires deliberate recruitment rather than waiting for bids to arrive.

Maxwell's account centers on how Skanska reaches contractors that operate in the communities surrounding its projects. That local-first approach matters to firms in Los Angeles County and the broader Southern California market, because it suggests that proximity to the work and roots in the local trade community carry weight when a prime assembles its team. Contractors that can demonstrate a nearby footprint and relevant experience stand to benefit from that preference.

For firms weighing whether to pursue subcontract packages on airport programs, the scope of work on a facility like LAX spans nearly every trade. Airport modernization generally involves extensive sitework and earthwork, utility relocation, concrete structures, terminal and roadway improvements, and heavy mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems. Specialty trades ranging from concrete and steel to electrical, HVAC, low-voltage systems, and finishes all find a place on projects of this size.

That breadth is precisely why participation goals create genuine opportunity. A single large program can be broken into dozens of subcontract and supply packages, and many of those packages are sized in a way that smaller firms can realistically pursue. Certified disadvantaged and small business enterprises that position themselves early can compete for scopes in earthwork, paving, structural work, mechanical and electrical systems, materials supply, trucking, and professional services tied to the construction effort.

The changes referenced in Skanska's outreach discussion point to an evolving environment for DBE requirements on federally supported work. For contractors, shifting rules around certification and participation can mean both new eligibility and new competition. Firms that stay current on how these programs are administered, and on which certifications open doors on airport and transit work, will be better placed to capture the packages that primes are required to distribute.

The practical lesson from the LAX experience is that primes are building relationships before bid packages hit the street. Skanska's model of reaching out to local contractors indicates that the firms that show up early, register with the relevant certification programs, and make themselves known to the prime's outreach staff are the ones who get invited to bid the right scopes.

## San Diego Braces For El Niño Storm Infrastructure Work

San Diego is preparing for a forecasted "super El Niño" winter that could bring severe flooding and coastal storm damage, putting a spotlight on the region's aging stormwater systems and century-old dams.

The condition of the city's outdated drainage networks and old dam infrastructure raises the prospect of upgrade and repair work as officials move to reduce flood risk ahead of extreme weather.

Contractors interested in this kind of work should first confirm their certification status. Disadvantaged business enterprise, small business enterprise, and related certifications are the gateway to participation credit on federally funded projects, and a current certification is often a prerequisite for a prime to count a firm toward its goals. Firms that let certifications lapse or never pursue them may find themselves shut out of packages they could otherwise win.

Beyond certification, firms should make direct contact with the compliance and outreach staff who assemble project teams. The account from Skanska underscores that these officers actively track which local contractors are available and capable. Getting on that radar means providing clear information on bonding capacity, relevant past work, available crews and equipment, and the specific trades a firm self-performs.

On bid timing, contractors should recognize that outreach and prequalification typically run well ahead of formal subcontract solicitations. The primes that hit their participation targets do so because they cultivate a pool of qualified local firms in advance. Waiting until a bid advertisement appears often means arriving too late to be considered, so firms should engage program teams during the planning and early construction phases.

For the Southern California construction community, the LAX example is both a reminder and an invitation. Large airport, transit, and infrastructure programs continue to generate substantial subcontracting work across the region, and the mechanisms that steer a share of that work to small, local, and disadvantaged firms are being actively used by at least one major prime. Contractors that keep their certifications current, understand how participation goals shape award decisions, and build direct relationships with outreach staff will be best positioned to turn these programs into signed subcontracts.

For contractors, aging stormwater and dam assets typically translate into demand for civil and water-infrastructure projects, from drainage improvements to structural rehabilitation of dams.

Firms working in San Diego County should watch for accelerated public-works spending tied to storm preparedness and emergency repairs as the El Niño season develops.
